International Association of Medieval Latinists (IAML)

At the end of the Third International Medieval Latin Congress on «The Eleventh Century», more than ninety participants in the congress assembled on the afternoon of 12 September 1998 for an open meeting in Lady Mitchell Hall of the University of Cambridge. Under the direction of W. Berschin as President of the Internationales Mittellateinerkomitee and J. Ziolkowski as Vice President the intention of the Komitee to continue the series of congresses was accepted with approval. M. Herren proposed Toronto as a possible site for a congress, while M.C. Díaz y Díaz made public the possibility of holding a congress in Compostela.

Then a series of possible themes for congresses was proposed and discussed. In a vote by show of hands the most votes were for *Latin Poetry in the Middle Ages* (with 39 votes), *The Multiform Text* (with 37 votes), and *Medieval Latin Writers as Readers* (with 28 votes).

In response to a question about the proceedings of the Third International Medieval Latin Congress, M. Herren explained his readiness to publish them in the Publications of the Journal of Medieval Latin in two or three years. C. Leonardi pointed out that the possibility also exists to print out the proceedings in the same form as those of the Second Congress (*Gli umanesimi medievali*), namely, as part of the *Edizioni del Galluzzo*.

Finally, the draft of the statutes of the International Association of Medieval Latinists which had been approved on 7 March 1998 by the Komitee was discussed point by point and approved in the following version by an overwhelming majority:

1. The International Association of Medieval Latinists (IAML) is conceived as the union of scholars active in the field of Medieval Latin studies.
2. Its congresses facilitate the exchange of information about current and planned research; in certain circumstances the coordination of research plans, the planning and advancement of joint scholarly projects, and the providing of information about the state of the field in universities and research facilities.
3. The IAML meets regularly during the International Congresses of Medieval Latinists.
4. The IAML elects a committee (the International Committee of Medieval Latinists) consisting of a maximum of 20 members. In this list of nominations efforts should be made to include the greatest number of countries in which Medieval Latin is studied. The existing Medieval Latin

- Committee will remain in office until the fourth Medieval Latin Congress where the Association will be asked to elect a Committee.
5. The Committee carries out tasks on behalf of the assembly of members, concerns itself with the preparation of information, and prepares for the next upcoming congress.
 6. Membership in the IAML —according to the terms in paragraph 1— takes effect and terminates in a written statement to a Committee member. The assembly of members resolves disputed cases.

With that the International Association of Medieval Latinists that had been called into existence in 1993 had its statutes, and all those active in the field of Medieval Latin are hereby requested to join the International Association of Medieval Latinists (IAML) by a written declaration, with the fullest possible indications of address (preferably with fax and e-mail).
